

Sister Genowefa (Genevieve) Potaczala belongs to the Missionary Sisters of Christ the King for Polish Immigrants. Sister has been living in the United States since 2002 and has worked as an archivist at Orchard Lake for four years. Much of her career she has been spent in education, where she was a teacher of Polish as a foreign language for several years in Chicago at St. Ferdinand School, St. Mary of the Angels School, and Notre Dame High School for Girls. She was also a teacher at three Polish Saturday schools in Chicago and Newark, as well as Principal of a Polish Saturday school in Chicago for eight years (a school with nearly one thousand students).

Sister Genowefa obtained a Master degree in three fields: Master of Divinity at the Pontifical Faculty of Theology in Poznan (Poland), Master of Arts in History at Adam Mickiewicz University in Poznan, and Master of Arts in Graduate Education at North Pak University in Chicago. In addition, she completed postgraduate studies, teaching Polish as a foreign language at the Maria Curie – Sklodowska University in Lublin (Poland).

As an historian, Sister authored the history of three parishes – one in Poland and two in the United States (Holy Trinity Parish at Chicago, and Our Lady of Czestochowa at Sterling Hts. MI). For three years, she was a member of a research team from the Catholic University of Lublin, which focuses on the research of Polish parishes in the USA.

History has always been one of her greatest passions and working in the archives was always her dream. Before she took her dream job, she attended a course for archivists organized by the head of the State Archives in Warsaw.
